

Reservations: Land Grabs of
Past Rob True Native Texans of Indigenous History

Despite being indigenous to Texas, many tribes' ability to claim reservation lands has been stifled historically and today. Now, as tribes seek to find recognition, Texas' long history of private land ownership is hindering their ability to form sovereign and autonomous lands as other tribes have re-won theirs after centuries of broken treaties.

"The environmental elements of traditional territories are embedded in our stories, epistemologies, and social worlds. Land, and space, is – of course – not interchangeable. The logic of forced removal reflects that very fact."
