Live Music Gradually Returns to Live Music Capital of the World

Venues and musicians are fighting to maintain Austin's reputation as the Live Music Capital of the World. However, while the lights turned off, bills did not stop and venues struggled to make rent. Red River Street hosts the largest cluster of live music venues in the city and is known as a cultural tourism destination. Red River Cultural District Director Cody Cowan said Austin has about 50 full-time venues and only enough city government funding for half of them.
